

KEREM TÜKSELOĞLU WAS A FINALIST AT THE FESTIVAL

Istanbul Gelisim University (IGU),
Faculty of Fine Arts Radio, Cinema and
Television Department
Lecturer/Director Kerem Yükseloğlu
became a finalist in the 59th Golden
Orange Film Festival in the National
Short Film Competition category with
the film "One Way".

Antalya Golden Orange Film Festival will take place in Antalya between 5 -18 November 2022. It is known that the festival, which will be held for the 59th time this year, was organized by ANSET under the auspices of Antalya Metropolitan Municipality. In the festival, which competed in the categories of national feature films, national documentary films, national short films, and international feature films, the film of Lecturer/Director Kerem Yükseloğlu was also a finalist this year. Yukseloglu, who will compete with his rivals in the National Short Film Competition category with the film "One Way", answered our questions about the film "One Way" and upcoming projects...





What is the origin story of the movie One Way?

On the night of May 12, 2018, I noticed a snail stuck to my windshield while driving my car. We traveled together along the way, and then that beautiful spring evening was colored by a sudden downpour... If I turned the wipers on, the snail would die. So I proceeded slowly, my windshield filled with water, and I stuck my head out of the window and tried to travel like that for a while. In the end, we got home safely, both of us...

After this journey, I questioned: Why did I do this? The world is full of bad people, the world is full of people hurting each other and putting their own rights above those of others, targeting the lives of others. While thinking about these, this story came to my mind and I immediately wrote the flow in the short film and sent it to a few friends. As a result of the brief consultation I had with them, the original story of the film was born.

What are your expectations from the festival?

Of course, I would love to see good developments for our film and to return with an award. But being there, being a finalist is really exciting and proud for a filmmaker. My biggest expectation is to have a calm, inspiring process and to return home learning new things.

What will be the process of One Way movie after the festival?

We can say new festivals and new journeys. I'm sure our producer İpek Erden has great plans.

Are there any new projects?

I am a person who breathes by writing and clings to life by writing. If I'm still alive today, it's because of my ability to tell stories. So, of course, I work on new stories and new ideas. One of the stories I was working on was accepted into a good script lab. In short, we are on the way...




AHMET BİKİÇ ASSUMES THE DIRECTOR OF THE INTERNATIONAL SHORT FİLM FESTIVAL!

ASST. PROF. AHMET ÖZEL ATTENDED "ARNICA ART LAND" ART WORKSHOP!






Asst. Prof. Ahmet Özel, a faculty member of Istanbul Gelisim University (IGU), Faculty of Fine Arts, Department, of Graphic Design attended the "Arnica Art Land" Art Workshop. Organized for the first time this year and curated by Denizhan Özer, "Arnica Art Land" hosted 34 artists. "Arnica Art Land" brought together valuable artists in Mersin's Borcak Plateau. The artists, who met under the curatorship of Denizhan Özer, started to produce works that refer to the unifying power of art and nature while reflecting their original styles on canvas surfaces. Arnica Art Land, which is the pioneer of many events that are thought to make an impact in the following years, was held between 23-30 August 2022.

While the artists reflect their original styles on canvas surfaces, they produced works that refer to the unifying power of art and nature.

Bringing master painters and young painters together on Borcak Plateau, located at an altitude of 800 meters on an area of approximately 30 decares, the "Arnica Art Land" Art Workshop offers painters a unique atmosphere for the production of works. It is known that the workshop space, which is completely inside the forest, belongs to the father of Senur Akın Biçer, Chairman of the Board of Arnica. Curator Denizhan Özer stated that they chose the venue because they thought that this space would excite the artists and motivate them to produce.

Schools are opening...

Beware of! Our Children's Health is in Our Hands

ASST. PROF. DR. MURAT DOĞAN



Asst. Prof. Dr. Murat Doğan's new article with the title "Schools Are Opening... Attention! Our Children's Health is in Our Hands" appeared in the September issue of Yemek Zevki magazine.

In his article, Doğan made recommendations for proper nutrition so that children can grow up and complete their development in a healthy way. Noting that malnutrition causes diseases such as obesity, he emphasized the importance of especially milk, cheese and yogurt in the immune system and strong muscle and skeletal structure.

The article written by Asst. Prof. Dr. Murat Doğan is quoted as follows:

"Doğan gave nutritional advice for students as schools opened"

As you know, schools are opening soon. Most parents, myself included, have a sweet fuss. Our children, and especially our school-age students, will be away from home all day. Their health is very important to us and one of the most important factors affecting health is our children's eating habits.

We all know that the foundation of healthy eating habits in children is laid in our preschool homes and then at school. In this sense, the restriction of foods that may adversely affect health must be in these periods. Eating habits that start especially in early childhood and primary school determine the nutritional behaviors that children will continue throughout their lives.

Our children spend most of their time at school. For this reason, the most effective environment outside the home where healthy eating habits are adopted is schools. School age includes children between the ages of six and twelve. However, since our children's school periods are now long-term, it is useful to increase this age to eighteen. The growth process in children also requires a significant intake of nutrients. In addition, it is very important that the foods that children of this age group should consume are of high quality and in sufficient proportions in order to obtain sufficient and balanced energy and nutrients.

BAbout seven years ago, when I was the head of the Department of Nutrition and Dietetics at the university, we planned a beautiful project with our director of National Education in Istanbul in order to help our children adopt healthy eating habits. First of all, we listed our primary and secondary schools in that district and programmed the trainings. Afterwards, our senior dietitian candidates explained healthy nutrition to our children one day a week for ten weeks in a detailed and entertaining way. We received very good feedback from our children and even their parents with the trainings. I also supported our students by visiting a few of our schools every week. During a school visit, a parent said, "My son doesn't want to eat junk food anymore." he said. I was so happy. The healthy nutrition project we started has been going on for seven years in the same district. However, I think that it has not been announced to the public very much. I think it would be very honorable and beneficial for me to spread such studies to the whole of Turkey.

"Correct Nutrition!"

Returning to our subject, the needs for nutrients are also high due to the rapid physiological development in school-age children. requirement may vary according to their growth rate, genetic and metabolic differences. However, it is not enough for children at this age to take basic nutrients in order to ensure their growth and healthy development. It is necessary to prevent all acute and chronic diseases and to maintain good mental health. This can only be achieved with a proper diet. This is water, protein, fat, carbohydrates, minerals, vitamins, etc. It depends on taking all the nutritional components with the right diet and maintaining this situation.

In this context, meals should not be skipped, and meals should be eaten in three main meals and one or two snacks. Adequate sunbathing, fresh air and play are complementary elements of a healthy diet. Healthy eating habits acquired at school age not only form the basis of permanent habits in adulthood, but also unhealthy eating habits lay the foundation for chronic diseases related to nutrition in later ages. Overweight children at school age are twice as likely to be obese than non-obese children. It is a fact that obesity and related cardiovascular diseases, diabetes and some types of cancer are caused by unhealthy eating habits at school age.



In fact, prevention of obesity and other related diseases is possible with adequate and balanced nutrition. Meals should be arranged according to the way to and from school. Many studies show that most of the children go to school without breakfast. Being hungry all night and going to school without breakfast in the morning adversely affects our children's mental activities at school and reduces their school success. For this reason, children should be woken up at least half an hour before going to school in the morning and have a nice breakfast. It would be much better if they did not buy products such as pastry from outside. Apart from the food they take to school, taking sugary foods from the canteen between meals should also be minimized. Our children should be provided with the choice of foods that are beneficial for their health.

It is very important for our children to take the carbohydrates, proteins, fats, vitamins and minerals they need in a balanced way so that they can have a healthy diet. I would like to end my article by briefly mentioning them.

"At least two servings of milk, cheese, yogurt a day"

Protein, calcium and vitamin D, which are necessary for our children to have strong skeletal structure, strong teeth and strong muscles, can be easily taken from milk and products. We should feed our children at least two servings of milk, cheese and yoghurt group foods per day. Protein, iron, B vitamins and some minerals, which are necessary for our children to have healthy blood and circulation and strong muscles, can be easily obtained from eggs, meat, chicken, fish and legumes. We should give four to five servings of these foods a day.



DOCUMENTARY FILMING OF KAVILCA WHEAT, AN ANCESTRAL SEED OF 13 THOUSAND YEARS, HAS STARTED!

The documentary film directed by Istanbul Gelisim University (IGU), Faculty of Fine Arts, Communication and Design Department Lecturer and Director Ahmet Bikic will focus on traditional agriculture and modern agriculture, emphasizing the importance and contribution of the 13 thousand-year-old ancestor seed Kavılca wheat to the region. It is known that Kavılca wheat, which is one of the two genetically unchanged wheat types in our country, preserves its unique characteristics in its seed with its 13 thousand-year history. With the increase in the production and consumption of other wheat flours over time, Kavilca wheat, which remained in the background, continued to be produced and consumed in more limited regions. With this documentary film, it is aimed to raise awareness by emphasizing the importance of the 13 thousand-year-old ancestral seed Kavilca.

Before shooting Lecturer and Director Ahmet Bikic and his team explored the shooting locations in Ardahan. After the shooting locations were determined within the scope of the project, the shooting of the 13 thousand-year-old ancestral seed Kavilca, which left its mark on the palate, began in Ardahan under the direction of Ahmet Bikiç. In this context, the story of Kavilca wheat and its contribution to the region will be conveyed in the documentary project, which can be evaluated in the context of ending hunger, achieving food security and good nutrition, and supporting sustainable agriculture, which are included in the United Nations Development Goals. documentary film project "13 Thousand Years Ancestor Seed Kavilca Wheat"; It comes to life with the support of Ardahan Governorate, Provincial Directorate of Agriculture and Forestry, Ardahan University and Serhat Development Agency.

The Oscar of Gastronomy World, "Michelin Guide" is Coming to Istanbul!






"Selected Restaurants will be Announced on October 11th!"

The international Michelin Guide, which is published in thirty-seven different countries every year, evaluates restaurants in terms of service quality, taste and atmosphere, and gives stars to restaurants in return. In order to be a Michelin-starred restaurant in a country, the Michelin guide must be published in that country.

t is known that there are no Michelin-starred restaurants in Turkey yet, as it is one of the countries where the relevant guide has not been published until recently. The restaurants selected by Istanbul's participation in the guide will be announced on October 11 and there will now be starred restaurants in Turkey. As a result of the audits, successful restaurants can receive one, two or three stars. One star is a very good restaurant in the area of the restaurant; two stars, the restaurant is excellent enough to change people's course; three stars indicate that the restaurant is worth a special trip. One-star restaurants are subject to regular inspections every one or two years. It is known that the more stars a restaurant has, the more frequent inspections are made.



We interviewed Asst. Prof. Dr. Sezgin Savaş, Deputy Dean of FAF

Deputy Dean of the Faculty of Fine Arts Head of Department of New Media and Communications



We made an interview with Asst. Prof. Dr. Sezgin Savaş who is deputy of Istanbul Gelisim University, Faculty of Fine Arts and Head of the Department of New Media and Communication at the Faculty of Economics, Administrative and Social Sciences. And we asked questions about his academic life, his administrative duties, the importance of conducting interdisciplinary studies, and the reflections of interdisciplinary studies on students.

Hello dear Asst. Prof. Dr. Sezgin Savas, first of all, can you tell us a little about yourself and your academic life?

Hello. I completed my undergraduate education at Istanbul University, Faculty of Communication, Department of Journalism. I completed my master's and doctorate education in the same university on Public Relations and Publicity. I have been working at Istanbul Gelişim University since 2015. Since that year, I have held many different positions, starting with being a research assistant at our university. After working in the Department of Public Relations and Promotion and the Department of New Media and Communication, respectively, I was appointed as the deputy of the Faculty of Fine Arts.

Can you talk about the contributions of working in different departments and can you talk about the challenging aspects, if any?

Although I have held many different positions in the past, deputy is one of the tasks I have undertaken for the first time. Previously, I also served as the head of the Department of New Media and Communication. However, position of deputy is a slightly different experience in administrative terms. I think the Faculty of Fine Arts is the right place for this experience. I think that working in different departments throughout my academic career is a subject that should be viewed from a more positive perspective. In each department I worked, I had the opportunity to see different perspectives and get to know different people. In an intellectual sense, it is possible to say that this richness has contributed to my academic career.

Could you tell us about your thoughts on the importance of conducting interdisciplinary studies?

Communication Sciences is a field that is very suitable for interdisciplinary work due to its nature. When the curricula of the departments evaluated under Communication Sciences are examined, Sociology, Psychology, Business, etc. There is an intense relationship with the fields. In this respect, a communication scientist has the chance to obtain information on many fields of social sciences. Today, especially considering Communication Sciences, we can see that interdisciplinary studies occupy an important place in the literature.

How do you reflect this positive and supportive perspective on interdisciplinary studies to your students within the scope of the courses you teach?

As I mentioned before, interdisciplinary courses occupy an important place in our department. In our courses, we often make references to the Sociology and Psychology literature. Since our students are the communication scientists of the future, we try to instill an interdisciplinary perspective in them. Many of our undergraduate students today have the potential to continue their graduate and doctorate education and to step into their academic careers in the future. This multiple perspective is important not only for those who will become academicians, but also for our students who will work in private institutions after graduation. A communication scientist should be able to analyze what is going on around him. The mentioned analysis skill is closely related to knowledge. Therefore, it can be said that a communication scientist should be open to information about different fields.

Do you have industry experience, how did you spend your student years? Can you tell us about your next goals and plans?

I did my compulsory internship at a digital printer. I followed the printing processes there. This has been a good experience for me. I got freelance jobs. In these works, I also earned a certain amount of money by using programs such as Photoshop and Illustrator. I spent my student years designing projects step by step, taking courses in different genres and classes that are relevant to my department. I spent time seeing, participating and following innovations, interviews, and in-school activities in the field of design. My next plans and goals are to advance myself in the field of design. To take my work to the next level. To use and improve my knowledge and experience in different fields such as cinema and advertising. The most important thing is to stand on my own feet, so to speak, throughout my life with my work and studies.
