On Society, Architecture and Education



With a general view, architecture seems to be a field in which our daily life passes and therefore everybody speaks about or acts. However, it may be misleading to see an occupation based on thousands of years in narrow patterns.

In the intellectual plan, the product of architecture emerges by combining the concrete (mass-fullness) and the abstract (space-emptiness). In a broader sense, it is created by combining tactile and non-tactile elements. This act of creating, form-gaining, is the design-shape activity, which is a subjective process. Achieving reality or becoming definite, which the mystics call the creed-manifestation, ends with

the sharing of the idea, that is, its externalization. The series of activities briefly described here actually carries interactive features. In other words, it continues until the optimal or most satisfactory solution including other factors is found - including the production process. Design is an issue of intellectual property due to its subjective nature. However, it is also true that given the quantity and complexity of the products it is never a solitary effort; It requires cooperation between specialties. It has been like this throughout the ages. Societies have changed and developed. Knowledge and expertise areas have changed and developed. Needs have changed and developed. Tools and equipment have changed and improved. But the core of the matter has always remained.

The combination of these elements in the historical process has developed based on the materials and technology of the time. In this process, the memory and values of the society, hence its tastes, settle and form an important part of the culture of that period. Culture is not easy to transform and change, it is slow. However, the revolutionary changes occurring in the basic modes of production have affected this phenomenon, and still do.





Values that were slow in the early periods and therefore absorbed in long periods of time have permanent qualities in the memory of societies. Some people do not want their changes. The change, diversification and acceleration of the spread of knowledge diversified people's tastes. So is the use of technology and materials. It can be said that the diversity of references brought about by this situation brings along a confusion. It is possible to express the situation as wealth, depending on their point of view.

It is clear that architectural education is also affected by the dilemma mentioned above: There is a collective personal architectural values-kitsch conflict with the acceptance of architecture, which has reached the same level after being distracted over thousands of years. It only has four years from scratch to influence and guide students' understanding of architecture after graduation. The next is about their stance in life and their place in building production conditions.

In the 21st century, the design factor in architecture has come to the fore again for the reasons mentioned above. Design education, which is the backbone of architecture, is about teaching ways to be creative and innovative, and is significantly different from similar professions with its unique structure. One-to-one relationship with the student, in conceptual education, is a feature that should not be harmed, consecutive sequences and preservation.

Everyone makes this mistake at home: It can lead to typhoid

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Almost everyone consumes it by cooking during the day and reheating it the next day. Stating that this situation triggered the formation of bacteria and chemicals in waiting meals, Asst. Prof. Dr. Murat Doğan made warnings. Emphasizing that meals should be prepared and consumed daily, Doğan said: "The bacteria formed in the reheated food can lead to typhoid."

Meals that are cooked more than the number of people are put in the refrigerator to be eaten again the next day at everyone's home. The food that comes out of the refrigerator takes its place on the tables by being reheated. Drawing attention to the fact that this situation experienced in almost everyone's home is a mistake, Asst. Prof. Dr. Murat Doğan pointed out that reheated meals may cause food poisoning and typhoid, and warned about

cooking and storing the meals. Emphasizing that making and consuming food daily, especially in restaurants, is a definite rule in terms of food safety, Doğan said: "Our basic principle in terms of health should be to cook daily and consume it daily, this is the right thing. Our mothers and wives have to cook for a few days due to their working life."

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More than 70 thousand students attended career planning courses

Stating that obesity ranks second after smoking among the preventable deaths, Public Health Specialist Dr. Nurten Elkin stated that the number of childhood obesity is increasing day by day and has become an important public health problem. Dr. Elkin said: "The rate of being overweight is 14.6% and the rate of obesity is 9.9% in primary school second grade children."

Istanbul Gelisim University (IGU) Faculty of Health Sciences Child Development Department Head Asst. Prof. Dr. Nurten Elkin made statements about childhood obesity. Stating that the number of childhood obesity is increasing day by day all over the World Dr. Elkin said: "According to the data of Turkish Statistical Institute (TSI), the obesity proportion of individuals aged 15 is 19.6%. According to the data from Turkey Childhood Obesity Research (COSI-TUR) of

the 2016 rate of being overweight among primary school children in 2nd grade is 14.6% and obesity rate is 9.9%"

ABOUT NEW CORONAVIRUS



All necessary measures are taken for the **coronavirus** revealed in Turkey and the World at **Istanbul Gelisim University. Things to know about coronavirus are as follows:**

What are the new coronavirus symptoms?

- The most common symptoms are fever, cough and respiratory distress.
- In severe cases, pneumonia, severe respiratory failure, kidney failure and death may occur
- Incubation period is between 2 and 14 days.

How is the virus transmitted?

It can be transmitted by the contact of the droplets caused by **coughing and sneezing** with the contact of the **mouth**, **nose and eyes** of other individuals in certain environment and by touching the surfaces where the droplets adhere and taking hands **into the mouth**, **nose or eyes**.

What to do to be protected from the virus?

- When coughing or sneezing, the mouth and nose should be covered with a disposable tissue, if there is no handkerchief, the mouth should be closed with the upper sleeve or elbow, not with the palms.
- Handshaking and hugging should be avoided.
- Mouth, nose and eyes should not be touched with dirty hands.
- Hands must be washed for at least 20 seconds in accordance with the Handwashing Instructions found in the toilets. In the absence of water and soap, alcohol-containing hand antiseptics should be used. Cologne of 70-80 degrees also serve as disinfectants.
- Offices and classrooms must be ventilated hourly.
- Places frequently used by many people such as common areas and door handles should be disinfected every 2 hours.
- Hands must be washed after using public transportation.
- Because the virus progresses faster in people with low immune system; a balanced and healthy diet is required. Foods must be washed thoroughly before consumption.

What to do if there are symptoms?

- If you have come from countries with infections in the past 14 days, apply to the nearest healthcare facility by wearing a surgical mask.
- If you are coughing, have a fever and have difficulty at breathing, apply to the nearest healthcare facility by wearing a surgical mask.
- Always wear your mask when you are in the same room with a person who is recommended insulation at home.
