Margaret Atwood November 18,1939




#### **Some facts about George Eliot**




- George Eliot is her pen name that she took from her partner, literature critic George Henry Lewes. Her real name is Mary Anne Evans: "The place Eliot looks back on is usually the Warwickshire coutryside. There, under her real name, Marian Evans, she spent her childhood at Arbury Farm (The Norton Anthology, English Literature).

  - Eliot writes in Victorian Period when women are seen as objects. In contrast to general belief in her era, Eliot introduces readers a strong and independent women like Dorothy in her well-known novel Middlemarch.

The Mill on the Floss (1860)
Silas Marner (1861)
Romola (1862-1863)
Middlemarch (1871-1872)

• Some of her novels have been made into Tv series such as Silas Marner (1985), The Mill on the Floss (1997), Adam Bede (1918) and Romola (1924).






#### Some facts about Margaret Atwood

- Canadian poet, novelist, essayist and literary critic
  Margaret Atwood wrote an opera named Pauline. She
  wrote the story and the words.
- Her famous work The Handmaid's Tale is dedicated to Mary Webster, who was accused of being a witch.

Just like Eliot, Atwood longs for presenting an independent woman in her novella The Penelopiad. In contrast to Penelope in Homer's epic Odssey, who is portrayed as 'silent' and 'waiting', Atwood's portraying of her is raising her voice.

# Some of her best novels are: The Handmaid's Tale Oryx and Crake The Robber Bride Alias Grace





Just like Eliot's novels, her novels The Handmaid's Tale(1990) and Alias Grace (2017) have been made into TV series.

# PROTECTING FROM THE VIRUS IN OUR HANDS


