
Where did it come from?

Yet, who is Valentine? The well-known is a Roman priest named Saint Valentine.






Saint Valentine

Emporer Claudius II who was an ambitious ruler, was into war and he asked for all the young men to join his army instead of marrying.


Consequently, he banned marriages all together.




Screeched is the longest one-syllable word in English


