After giving information about basic information and concepts, what can be done in the first 72 hours, called "Golden Hours" in disasters, was discussed, and the precautions and practices that should be taken before, during and after disasters were conveyed.







# Department of Interior Architecture and Environmental Design Digital Promotional Video Shooting Completed

The Department of Interior Architecture and Environmental Design that aims to educate well-equipped graduates who can plan, calculate cost, work plan and manage the construction site in the subjects of interior design and environmental design, taking into account the social life, prepared video content that informs everyone.

For this purpose, shootings were made with a group of volunteer students in different locations of the design studio located in Gelişim Tower. Radio, Television and Cinema Department Res. Asst. Okan Kırbacı and Res. Asst. Eda Cekemci took part. The shootings started with the information about the department by the Head of the Interior Architecture and Environmental Design Department, Asst. Prof. Dr. Zerrin Funda Ürük, and the knowledge and experiences of our students Koray Alp Kaleli, Mahmut Mert Çelik, Oğuzhan Alp, Saleha Hallaç and Mine Öztürk who wanted to take part in the shootings voluntarily.

Head of Interior Architecture and Environmental Design Department, Asst. Prof. Dr. Zerrin Funda Ürük shared her feelings and thoughts on the day of the video shoot as follows:





"After the pandemic that lasted for 13 months, it was very nice and full of emotion to meet our students again in our design studio. Being able to see their progress even on the screen, and making plans about their career paths after graduation, even in this short time, reminded us of our old days. I wish success to all our graduates in their career paths, and I wish our students a good time to work together in the new term."









A research was conducted in first and second class restaurants on the determination of food waste generated in restaurants in Istanbul. As a result of the research, the units where the waste is formed the most, the food groups that create the most waste and the evaluation methods of these wastes were examined. The results showed that vegetables create waste in the kitchen at a rate of 68%, followed by meats and bread group, frozen foods, breakfast products and appetizers. Emel Çirişoğlu, Research Assistant from Istanbul Gelişim University Gastronomy and Culinary Arts Department, who conducted the research:

"Considering that vegetables are the food group that creates the most waste, 49 million tons of vegetables and fruits are produced in Turkey every year. When we look at this production, only 52 percent of fruits and vegetables can only reach consumers. The remainder is estimated to be wasted between 25 percent and 40 percent due to exposure to bad conditions in the food supply chain" she said.







In the study, which includes similar ideas in the aesthetics of painting and music of the Baroque period, Castel's "color keyboard", which he designed to associate notes with colors and potentially combining two arts, was emphasized.

# Could we get to know you? When and how did your interest in art begin?

I can say that my tendencies towards art started in my childhood. I used to make drawings of comic book heroes and family members portraits of that period. However, I had no idea that I would pursue this field as a profession. In the difficult conditions of that period, this field could be suitable for people with opportunities. My family wanted me to study more engineering or architecture. I graduated from the science department of Kabatas Erkek Lisesi, which I studied for these fields. By coincidence, I learned that the State Academy of Fine Arts existed. When I passed the exams that I took without preparation, my profession was determined for me. I graduated from the High Painting Department of the Academy in 1982. I can say that my passion for my profession and my professional belonging have been strengthened both during the academy period and after graduation. Since then, I have been actively involved in the art environment, holding exhibitions and participating in events. I can say that national and international vocational workshops and trips are activities that feed me professionally.

We would like to know about your artworks. How would you describe your painting style?

I have had many phases in my painting adventure, starting from the figurative period and extending to the abstract period. If I talk about my concept in general; I paint with a perspective that

questions the formation of the universe, its sequences, and my own existence. In this painting attitude, I have an approach that looks for traces of my own ancestral origin and tries to understand it through mythological narratives. Many past experiences or mythological discourses, many 'things' that I believe are hidden in DNA, whose meaning we do not know, and which float in our memory, are the materials of my painting. I try to reflect these materials on canvas and paper with an abstract view and my own unique understanding of composition.

# So who are the artists that influenced you the most?

When you start walking in art, your masters turn into people who try to find you. Sometimes when you are influenced by them and travel together, they turn into energy sources that feed you. I like Renaissance Masters. I can say that Leonardo da Vinci, Pieter Bruegel, Jan Van Eyck, Hans Holbain are the masters of this period that I was influenced by. I find

Picasso, Matisse, Braque, Malevich and Kandinsky, who are the important masters of the 20th century, very important both in terms of their painting attitudes and because of their pioneering personalities, in terms of the philosophical richness they added to the field of painting. In Turkish painting, Avni Lifij and Sabri Berkel impressed me a lot as real, master artists.

As a very important academician of our Faculty of Fine Arts, what is the place of art in our lives and what is your opinion today's art education?

Thank you for such a question. It is very valuable for me to try to contribute as a teacher to students who prepare themselves professionally in all areas of life. In fact, we try to give them a positive life energy through art. We try to make

them look at life with a positive spirit. By trying to develop their professional passions, we want them to approach both their own lives and the environment they will be in in the future with a more creative thought and a more aesthetic perspective. The individual experience

of our instructors in this field is also a great gain for the students. Undoubtedly, when we evaluate it together with the pandemic period and the digital age, the changed perception of art in this period requires some reevaluations and regulations in terms of education. In this regard, we should talk about 'how new art education should be' in schools in the coming periods.

Once again what would you like to say to the students of Istanbul Gelişim University?

Despite the difficult process that the pandemic period has given us, I think that






In Tanpinar's book, in which he describes each city from a different perspective, we travel to Ankara, Erzurum, Konya, Bursa and finally to Istanbul. The important point in the book Five Cities is that it historically describes the dynamic structure of cities and their changes over time due to many internal and external factors with detailed spatial descriptions. Approaching cities by establishing a very strong link between time and space, Tanpinar mentions the importance of the layered structure and historical richness of cities and conveys his sadness to us that these riches can wear out and disappear for many reasons.

While expressing his sadness for the past and the lost, he continues to talk about the future of cities in a hopeful way, as he sees cities as living and constantly changing systems. We can say that this book by Tanpınar will be useful and thought-provoking for the students of fine arts faculty who develop themselves in finding solutions to changing dynamics and problems with their creative ideas.





# The Importance And Processing Of The History Of Art And Design Course, Covering A Wide Period From Prehistory To The Present



Istanbul Gelisim University Faculty of Fine Arts Department of Communication and Design Art Historian Assistant Professor Çağlayan Hergül evaluated the importance of the History of Art and Design course:

"The beginning of the 20th century is a period that witnessed the formation of modern art. The image world, which was based on the direct reflection of the classical figure until this period, went to the way of grasping the figure or the object, leaving its place to a new era that art could not express until now. Interestingly enough, many artists such as Hanri Matisse, Pablo Picasso, and Vasiliy Kandinsky have guided modern art around the concept of "Primitive Art". Here, the activities of the artists that I mentioned before, in search of the primitive and with it the essence, take us to the history of art. When we look


at it from this perspective, the importance of our "History of Art and Design" course is here: Questioning memory and creating a new memory. To witness the formation of this artistic memory and to be able to analyze it. To give an example, the "bull" figure is perhaps best suited for this. The visual adventure of the bull figure, a mythological figure starting from the cave walls and extending to Picasso, lies in Art History. The importance of the "History of Art and Design" course lies under the ability to analyze even a single figure. For a faculty of fine arts student, perhaps the most important achievement of being able to do this analysis is to be inspired and discover the ore in themselves."



# Web Designer

#### **Graphic Design**

Web designers plan and create the design and interfaces of web pages, using their technical knowledge and designer skills to produce websites that meet the needs of clients. Web designers may also be responsible for maintaining an existing site. When working on large and complex projects it may be necessary to travel to client sites and these may be present for the duration of the project. It is a profession which is home-office commonly.



# **UX** Designer

#### **Communication Design**

User experience design (UX) in English, is the name given to the process of supporting user behavior through the usability provided in interacting with a product. It is aimed to guide the user in the easiest way, with both the interface design and the color palette preferences. For example, in frequently used internet banking, an easy-to-use and uncomplicated interface is an important reason for the customer to choose that bank.

# Videographer

#### Radio, Cinema and Television

A 'Videographer' is the person responsible for recording live events and small scale video productions. Cameramen focus on smaller productions such as documentaries, live events, short films, weddings, birthday parties, sporting events, commercials and educational videos. Today, due to the majority of such events, it is a field that is frequently sought and needs experience.

# **Artificial Meat Specialist**

#### **Gastronomy Department**

With artificial meat production, it is thought that some factors that cause negative effects on the environment and food safety originating from traditional production can be eliminated. It is also planned to prevent concerns about animal comfort by responding to the wishes of the modern world people. The benefits that can be provided by the production of artificial meat; It can be summarized as reducing the greenhouse gases originating from animal production and thus contributing to the prevention of global warming, preventing deforestation, using agricultural lands and grain products to meet the nutritional needs of people, eliminating the necessity of slaughtering many animals and providing the protein need of the increasing human population. So how is artificial meat produced? The most common are meats produced from alternative protein sources known as meat alternatives. These usually consist of plants and truffle. Alternatively, cultured meat and 'In-Vitro' meat derived from tissues and cells grown in vitro instead of live microorganisms are available. The people responsible for the production of these meats are called artificial meat specialists.





# **Smart Building Techinician**

#### **Interior Architecture and Environmental Design**

Also known as an automation technician, she/he is a person who works in the installation and maintenance processes of devices or systems working with automation technology. The automation technician implements the production plans prepared by the automation engineer and controls the quality standards of the manufactured product. Automation technicians can work in public institutions and organizations and private companies. Automation is the process of doing things with automatic tools without human labor in industry, management and technical works. In order to maximize energy efficiency in smart buildings, energy use is made on behalf of the entire building, again within the scope of the systems in the building, in a controlled manner.

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
