



In line with my desire for airplanes and aviation since my childhood and my career plans that I established step by step, I started my undergraduate education in 2018 in Istanbul Gelisim University UBYO Aircraft Maintenance and Repair Department, which has the SHGM Recognized School Status. I was entitled to receive the Recognized School Certificate by being exempt from all module exams organized by our school within the scope of Recognized School authorization. I graduated as a High Honor Student in 2022. In line with the opportunities offered by our school and my own efforts, I started the Management Department Double Program in 2019 and I am currently continuing my education.



In addition to the theoretical and practical lessons I took from our valuable teachers who are experts in their fields throughout my education life, I attended the "Aircraft Maintenance English, Dangereous Goods Regulations (DGR), Minimum Equipment List (MEL)" certificate programs that will contribute to my career. In addition to the Module Exemption exams I took, I gained 3 years by reducing the experience period required to obtain the Aircraft Maintenance Technician License from 5 to 2 years, with the practical trainings I received in the Aircraft Hangar, Engine, Propeller, Structural and Aircraft Systems workshops in our school.



THE ROLE OF WOMEN IN THE WAR OF ÇANAKKALE AND THE IMPORTANCE OF 8 MARCH INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY...

"8 March International Women's Day" is celebrated every year on 8 March as a day where women's economic, social, political and cultural achievements are celebrated and women's rights are fought for. However, March 8, International Women's Day, is not a day to be celebrated, but a day to be remembered especially because of its history.

On March 8, 1857, 40,000 weaving women started a strike in New York State of the United States (USA) to protest for better working conditions, working hours and wages. The history of International Women's Day dates back to the women's rights movement that started in the 19th century. In 1908, 15,000 textile workers went on strike in New York, USA, demanding improved working conditions and rights such as the right to vote. Since most of the workers are women, the strike gave a great impetus to women's struggles for working conditions and rights.



International Women's Day, first celebrated in the USA in 1909, was officially recognized by the United Nations (UN) in 1975. At the 2nd International Conference of Socialist Women held in Copenhagen in 1910, it was decided to celebrate 8 March as "International Women's Day". This date is a date chosen after the "Women's Day" celebrated in the Russian Empire at that time. International Women's Day gained great importance in Russia in 1917.

International Women's Day is of great importance in terms of supporting women's struggle for equality, justice and human rights, raising awareness on gender equality, strengthening women's social, economic and political rights, emphasizing the importance of women's role in society, and carrying out works to protect women from physical, emotional and sexual violence. has.



It should not be forgotten that women have assumed important roles and achieved success in many ways throughout human history. Women played one of these important roles in the Battle of Dardanelles. The Battle of Dardanelles is a military operation and war that started on March 18, 1915 and ended on March 18, 1916. It is an important victory of the Ottoman Empire against the Allied Powers during the First World War and has an important place in Turkish history. In addition, this victory is of great importance in terms of reviving the national unity and the spirit of independence.

Contrary to what is known, during the Dardanelles War, women served not only behind the front but also at the front and in areas close to the front. One of the women who participated in the war at the front is Mujahide Hatice Hanım, who served in the 56th Division in Çanakkale Anafartalar. Another is Zeynep Mido Çavuş, who was among the volunteers who came from Kosovo to the Battle of Dardanelles. It is also known that Gazi Fatma Cavus served in the 19th Division with her father and older brother and fought for months. One of the most prominent names among the female heroes of the war is undoubtedly Nezahat Onbaş who participated in the war with her father and became the first person to be awarded the Independence Medal for his contribution to the War of Independence.

In addition to those who directly participated in the war at the front, women also played important roles in the regions close to the front. These tasks are usually health care, food supply, ammunition transport and evacuation of the wounded. Especially in the treatment and evacuation of the wounded, women played an important role in the most difficult times of the war, and some women were also involved in tasks such as providing morale and motivation to combat the psychological effects of war.







The women behind the front continued the production by working in the fields under the difficult conditions created by the war. This important role played by women in the Battle of Gallipoli is also of great significance in terms of showing that the war was not just for men. In addition, these duties undertaken by women in the war have been an important step regarding the necessity of Turkish women to take a more active role in social and political life.

"8 March International Women's Day" and "Çanakkale Victory" show that women should struggle to take a more active role in social and political life. Remembrance of women's sacrifices and contributions can be a source of motivation for women to have a greater say in society. DISASTER GUIDE INTERPRETING (ARÇ) ORGANIZATION MEMBER AND TRAINER PROF. DR. ALEV BULUT:

"ARÇ volunteers provide translation support in the process of international assistance in disasters in line with the purpose and working principles of the organization..."

First of all, we wish to thank you for accepting our interview request for the FoAS Monthly e-Bulletin. Could you tell us about the establishment and aims of the ARÇ (the Emergency and Disaster Interpreters)?

Thank you very much for your interest in ARÇ and for offering this interview. I wish quick recovery everyone those whom affected by the earthquake, sending my condolences to our country; our loss and pain are unbearable. ARÇ is a civil initiative that was established at Istanbul University after the 1999 Marmara earthquake and moved under the umbrella of the Translation and Interpreting Association. Its purpose is to provide communication support to foreign search-rescue and aid teams coming to our country within the framework of international assistance in disasters. ARÇ is an autonomous organization, it has its own regulation, and its officially affiliated to Translation and Interpreting Association. With the cooperation protocol we signed with the Istanbul Governor's Office and the Provincial Civil Defense Directorate in 2001, we made the state-university and NGO cooperation official. So far, we have given seminars to our volunteers, participated in national and international exercises, and ARC members took an active role in the Van Earthquake. In line with our aim, we were present to provide translation support in disasters by undertaking the training and communication of the volunteers who applied to us. Translation and Interpreting Association ARÇ link includes our current Turkish-English information and blog posts on social media accounts.





What are the working areas of the ARÇ and what services does it provide in disaster situations?

ARÇ volunteers provide translation support in the process of international assistance in disasters in line with the purpose of our organization and the working principles we have established. In line with our basic function, we conduct volunteer trainings and conduct face-to-face and online seminars to be ready for this task. We participate in national and international trainings (eg 2021 EU MODEX Tekirdağ Civil Protection Mechanism training). There is a Commissioning Unit of ARÇ at the center. The Field Team is also involved in emergencies and disasters. Headquarters and Field Coordinators coordinate and follow up translators within the framework of our cooperation protocol. We also monitor the arrival of foreign teams in Turkey through the United Nations network and keep our own records, in order to quickly direct the teams to the appropriate translators in the required languages. The aim is to contribute to the disaster response by providing communication support in our field, to be useful by acting in a certain preparation and organization.

What training do ARÇ members receive?

Those who want to be an ARÇ volunteer join our communication network by filling out the form at the Translation and Interpreting Association ARÇ link where translators may state how much time they can spend and what level of education. Then, these applications are grouped and one-day training seminars (face-to-face or online) and longer and applied ARÇ training are planned. These trainings have been held in Ankara and Izmir, apart from Istanbul, until now. According to the training content, whether the training is a one-day Volunteer Seminar or a longer Basic Training, that is, according to the training period, technical information about disasters, building knowledge, disaster management, trauma, working principles of foreign teams, as well as specialist training such as search and rescue and first aid, disaster assistance, communication in disasters, interpreting techniques and scenario applications, ARÇ principles and action plan sections. Up-to-date information is shared with those who are ARÇ members and remain in the communication network.



What kind of activities have ARÇ volunteers carried out and continue to carry out in the aftermath of the 2 major earthquake disasters centered in Kahramanmaras and affecting 11 provinces of our country?

The ARC telephone chain was started on the morning of February 6 and three ARC personnel went to the disaster area with the transportation facilities organized by AFAD and set up the ARC headquarter. Headquarters and field teams distributed their tasks. At the headquarters, I was in charge of monitoring communication and international cooperation in the Assignment Unit. Our field coordinators coordinated the volunteer interpreters who went to the earthquake zone. Cooperation was established with NGOs such as the Istanbul Chamber of Guides, the Turkish Conference Interpreters Association and the Professional Association of Translators. Trained ARÇ volunteers worked 24/7 to create a list of those who were ready for duty and those who wanted to take part, and kept watch. The Online ARÇ Assignment Form was intended to collect applications from the different translation NGOs and groups I mentioned earlier, as well as from individual applicants. As thousands of applications were received in a short period of time, the emphasis was on urgently sending the most suitable translators from the available list to the field to accompany the foreign teams as needed. Volunteers supported 50 teams in 11 languages until February 19. Our field team worked for days without a break in order to make the necessary number of referrals in the required languages. In short, while the ARÇ headquarters kept watch to monitor the arrival of foreign teams from international information, the field team took on the coordination of volunteer translators. It is not allowed for volunteers to work in the region without the approve of AFAD. The Translation Association-ARÇ organization signed the aforementioned cooperation protocol in 2001 and updated it in subsequent restructuring. Of course, there were many other translators in the field besides the more than 250 translators who went with the coordination of ARÇ. Some of them later joined the ARC network.





What is required by a translator to be a volunteer at ARÇ?

To become an ARÇ volunteer, you first need to fill in the ARÇ application form. As I mentioned above, you can get to know us better by reading the Translation and Interpreting Association's ARÇ link and the information and texts on our blog page, and you can follow the flow of information through the Translation and Interpreting Association on social media. Training seminars are planned with volunteers who fill in the form. There are many volunteers who fill in forms and follow us in our general communication network. Some of them have experience in interpreting and some are waiting to participate in ARÇ seminars. Especially for applicants from rare languages, the language itself is more important than the interpreting experience and our seminars take on a different meaning. There are many translation and interpreting students, graduates, trainers, researchers and volunteers among us. We hope to increase this number in a qualified way. It is a great asset for us that volunteer candidates have additional skills and experience in line with their own background, for example, being a radio amateur, underwater search and rescue, mountaineering experience, etc... In the field, ARÇ volunteers support international aid teams, but in order to protect ourselves and our environment, it is important to have basic disaster awareness, search and rescue and first aid training.

What are your suggestions for newly graduated translators or translator candidates whom interested in the translation sector to develop themselves in the field of community interpreting and to take part in organizations such as ARÇ?

There are many translation departments in our country, and I would love to see students and prospective translators focus on community interpreting. It is undoubtedly a great advantage to have studied and practiced interpreting in community services under the headings of health, law, disaster-emergency in school. We are an earthquake country, Istanbul is an earthquake city and there are many translation and interpreting students and trainers especially in this city, but since support for the Istanbul earthquake will come from other cities, it will be important for volunteers to come from regions that will be less affected by the earthquake. At the same time, we are a country that has welcomed many migrants and refugees. For this reason, community interpreting is always on our agenda in terms of delivering community services to everyone. If students and prospective translators gather together under offical, semi-official organizations and NGOs related to these issues and look for internship opportunities even before they graduate, perhaps it will be easier for them to work in the field or in the offices of institutions later on.



Thank you very much for your time and comprehensive information in the FoAS Monthly e-Bulletin.

I also thank you for your interest. I send my love to your students and readers who are thinking of becoming volunteer translators in disasters. I hope that such major disasters will never happen again in our country and that we will be prepared to prevent disasters from turning into major disasters. Again, my condolences to our country. I wish a better future for all of us, especially for our youth and children, where we can learn from these tragedies in the light of science.

ERASMUS+

You will be on the road, without stopping!

Hello, I am Rabia ŞENTÜRK, Research Assistant at Istanbul Gelisim University of UBF Aviation Management Department. I would like to share with you my visit to Žilina University in December 2022 within the scope of Erasmus+ Staff Training Mobility and my experiences there.

Within the scope of Personnel Training Mobility, I experienced a first as academic personnel who took advantage of the mobility within our faculty for a long period of two weeks. I think that the two-week duration of the mobility allows me to digest the process better and contributes more positively to my development in terms of education and culture.

Due to the lack of direct flights to Slovakia, I first arrived in Norway, then in Poland, and then in Žilina, Slovakia. In these countries where I stayed for one day, although the process was short, I collected valuable memories. I met the Erasmus+ coordinator at the university on the designated day and time. I participated in the orientation program prepared for me. With this orientation, I had the opportunity to learn about general information about their universities, campus information, their collaborations and opportunities. After the orientation presentation, a campus tour was held. Within the scope of the tour, classrooms, workshops, laboratories were toured, brief information about workshop and laboratory practices was shared. For the next two weeks, I attended my classes by following the weekly lesson schedule.

Although the curriculum differs according to each university, I traveled to different countries with one-hour trips due to the fact that I do not have classes every day and we have weekends. I think that Erasmus+ mobility contributes most culturally to academics. During my mobility, I had the chance to witness different cultures from six European countries: Norway, Poland, Slovakia, Hungary, Austria and Czechia. In this process, there were moments when I had difficulties, times when I was happy, new people I met, and new things I learned. I would like to thank Istanbul Gelisim University for helping me experience this process and our university administration for supporting us in this direction.



I would like to end my words with the advice of Prof. Dr. İlber Ortaylı: "You will be on the road, without stopping." We hope to share our experiences again in new activities that will contribute to us..

Nawruz



Dolmabahce Palace was built between 1844-1853 by Garabet and Nikogos Balyan by order of Sultan Abdulmecid. The palace has 285 rooms and 46 halls, 6 baths and 68 toilets. This work, which is an avant-garde study in the presentation of the relationship between accounting and culture, has carried out the arrangements to be made by giving a different perspective to most researchers.




His book on the interaction of accounting-culture, labeled "Accounting Climate", has a special meaning in his own words: When he does not mention any type of climate, listeners can more or less guess the crops grown in areas where that climate prevails. At the same time, it aims to change an understanding that sees the subject only on a mechanical level, by mistaking accounting as a mere recording technique, with the author's own expression.




The Goal -Eliyahu M. GOLDRATT / Jeff COX
