



Victory of Çanakkale

The Çanakkale Victory, also known as the Battle of Gallipoli or the Gallipoli Campaign, refers to a significant military engagement during World War I that took place on the Gallipoli Peninsula in present-day Turkey. The battle was fought between the Allied Powers, primarily British, French, Australian, New Zealand, and Indian troops, and the Ottoman Empire, from April 25, 1915, to January 9, 1916.



The Allies sought to secure a sea route to the Russian Empire through the Dardanelles Strait and capture Constantinople (now Istanbul), the capital of the Ottoman Empire. However, the Ottoman forces, under the command of Mustafa Kemal Atatürk, successfully defended their homeland, repelling numerous Allied assaults over a grueling nine-month campaign.





Despite the ultimately unsuccessful outcome for the Allies, the Çanakkale Victory is remembered as a defining moment in the history of Turkey, marking a significant defense of Turkish territory and contributing to the rise of Mustafa Kemal Atatürk, who later became the founder of the Republic of Turkey. The victory is celebrated annually on March 18th as a national holiday in Turkey.

Did you know?

The Gallipoli Campaign also known as the Dardanelles Campaign was a First World War campaign that took place on the Gallipoli Peninsula in the Ottoman Empire between 25 April 1915 and 9

January 1916.




